Thematic focus

 General title: "Taking stock and building partnership for sustainable development of the mountain and rural areas"

- Sub-theme I: "Building capabilities and facilitating participation of vulnerable groups in rural and mountain regions through SSE in multi-level sustainable development policy"
- Sub-theme II: "Bridging natural and social sciences for sustainable development through transdisciplinary approaches"

Thematic Areas of the Conference

During the abstract submission, participants will choose their preferred thematic area relevant for their paper. Based on the chosen thematic areas and submitted panels and papers, sessions will emerge. Additionally, it should be stressed that papers that in some form or capacity explore the role of social innovations in marginalized communities or the topics of transdisciplinary approaches in these topics are encouraged. The below list is not exhaustive but forms tentative thematic areas based on the **S4C Research Agenda 2020-2030**:

Timeline for CfPs, Submissions and Acceptance

- Announcement of the event with call(s) for papers and panels/events/workshops by the end of September/mid-October
- Call for sessions/side events/workshops: 15 October 2024-30 November 204
 - (with a form that includes session abstract, name of organizers, format (e.g. paper session, poster session, roundtable, pico session (sensu EGU), discussion panel, etc.), envisioned no. of participants in case of workshops...)
 - if agreed by the session organizers/conveners, they can be responsible for abstract evaluation and qualification for their sessions and the additional promotion of these sessions in their communities
 - Session title (no more than 25 words)
 - Overview and description of the session, including themes (chosen from the proposed list of thematic areas)
 - Session Chair and Co-Chair details
 - Envisioned no. of participants
- Call for panels: 15 December 2024-31 January 2025 (Extended deadline for panels: 31 March 2025)
 - Panel title and abstract (2-5 pages)
 - Panel subject and theme (chosen from the proposed list of thematic areas)
 - Email addresses of the Panel Chair and Discussants
- Call for papers: 15 December-28 February 2025 (Extended deadline for papers: 15 May 2025)
 - Title of the paper
 - Abstract (400 words), 3-8 keywords, 1-3 themes chosen from the proposed list of thematic areas
 - Email address of each paper presenter and co-author (if applicable)
- Panel acceptance notification: 15 February 2025 (15 April 2025)
- Abstract acceptance notification: 15 March 2025 (15 June 2025)
 - In the past we sent out the abstracts to be evaluated by session organizers and then discussed the placement in sessions together, last time this was decided by the organizing team/ session organizers; final programme had to be reshuffled though based on the actual number of presentations and participant schedules/presence, some consolidation of sessions also happened. Two weeks to assess submissions was tight but doable, esp. if session organizers would start with the abstracts coming in.
