The parties to the Carpathian Convention have agreed to take the initiative to establish the largest international park in Europe and are requesting financial and technical support from the EU.

This ambitious project will transform the Carpathian region, home to the most ecologically connected and biodiverse mixed forests in the European Union, into one of the largest transboundary parks in the world—seven times the size of Yellowstone.



# International Park

Making a difference... ans

- to the Carpathian Convention, unlike the Alpine Convention, and expects EU to demonstrate its commitment to the implementation of the Biodiversity Strategy 2030 and its protection targets.
- The Carpathians are poised to become a globally recognized brand, attracting millions of tourists each year, who spend hundreds of millions of euros in the communities surrounding the park.
- Smart forest protection zoning will significantly enhance the recreational value of the proposed Carpathian Park, quickly reaching an estimated value of 23 billion euros (approximately 453 euros per hectare).

## **Deterioration of biodiversity values**

Preserving Carpathian forests will not prevent floods or droughts in the region, but it can slow down water flow and enhance adaptation to fast changing climate in European continent.




## What if, yes... The Park Carpathians

Regional consultations about future park borders centered around identified high-biodiversity forests with other areas in connectivity based on the least-cost path analysis.

Building powerful brand and securing EU funds for developing management plans with shared principles and different protection zones to benefit rare nature and local communities.

Establishing International fund to help governments with purchasing land and compensating private forest owners.
